Welcome/Performance

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Brenda Kelting, RCAC President. Introductions were made by all present. The RCAC mission, vision, and ground rules were read. The June minutes were approved.

Open Mic – Community-Related

Martha Gammons announced that the Louisville Iris Society will have their annual sale on Saturday, August 1, at Frank Otte Nursery on Shelbyville Road.

Cheryl Fisher mentioned a recent newspaper article on the \$63 million development project proposed for Cane Run Road, which will include a Family Scholar House & apartments, and another article on the startup of the LG&E natural gas plant.

Open Mic – Plant-Related

Rich Robinson, American Synthetic Rubber Company, announced that he will move to another Michelin facility at the end of the year. He introduced Kathy Cameron, who will replace him as Environmental, Health, and Safety Manager.

MSD Stormwater Treatment Plan Update

Jay Thomas and Joe Bentley, MSD

Alex Novak, Operations Manager for the Morris Forman treatment plant briefly updated the group on the project to build a primary treatment plant to be used during wet weather. He introduced Jay Thomas and Joe Bentley who are managing the construction of the project. Photos were shared of the construction area, near the southwest pump station on Bells Lane. The function of the pump station is to accept two main sewer lines en route to the Morris Forman treatment plant. Currently, when the southwest pump station is overwhelmed during wet weather, excess untreated sewage overflows to the Ohio River through MSD's southwest outfall. This occurs approximately 61 times/year. The project underway on Bells Lane is designed to meet the requirements of an EPA consent decree, which should reduce the overflow events to approximately 8 times/year.

The Southwest pump station will be upgraded and an additional system will be installed to treat previously-untreated wastewater. There will be a 25 million gallon equalization system that will be visible from I-264. The station will be able to be run remotely and will not be manned 24/7.

The project contractor is Hall Contracting of Kentucky. The designer for the project is CH2M Hill. The project cost is \$38.5 million. Construction began in June 2014 and is scheduled to be complete in November 2016. The EPA consent decree deadline is December 2016.

Benefits of the project are that the amount of untreated water is reduced. Additional benefits include developing vacant property and improving the Louisville Loop in that area.

Questions surrounding odors were raised by Bev Jones. Alex Novak explained that odors related to this project are expected to be minimal as odor control is being built into the project. Odors mostly occur during dry weather. This project is built to operate only during wet weather events, so odors are expected to be mostly unaffected as a result of this project.

LEPC Safety Fair and Park DuValle Health Fair Planning

The EMA Safety Fair will be held on August 8 at the Riverside Gardens Park and the Park DuValle Health Fair will be held on August 15 at the Park DuValle Health Center. Alice Simpson circulated volunteer sheets for each event. A Wally Wiseguy handler is needed for each event.

RCAC 25th Anniversary Celebration

Rich Robinson reminded the group that RCAC will celebrate its 25th year in 2016. An ad hoc committee was formed to work on a celebration marking the event. Committee members are Paul Graf, Martha Gammons, Bev Jones, Corinne Greenberg, Lori Carson, and the company Program Committee co-chair for next year. Tom Herman, although retiring at the end of the year, expressed interest in working on the celebration.
