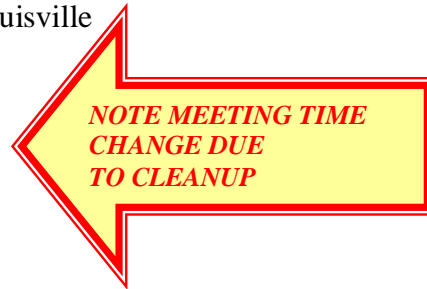

Welcome/Performance

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Brenda Kelting, RCAC Vice President. The RCAC mission, vision, and ground rules were read. Introductions were made by all present. The February minutes were approved with a revision to the attendance.

Open Mic – Community-Related

Company representatives Jana Zigrye and Rich Robinson, along with facilitator Cheryl Fisher attended the District 1 community meetings with new council member Jessica Green on March 3 at the Southwick Community Center and March 10 at the Lake Dreamland Fire Department. Community member Bev Jones attended the March 3 meeting and community member Earl Hartlage attended the March 10 meeting. Councilwoman Green has a new method for anonymously reporting problems in the district using her “hot spot” cards. Residents in District 1 should have received them in the mail.

Cheryl Fisher attended the Kentucky Safety and Prevention Alignment Network (KSPAN) quarterly meeting in Frankfort on March 11 at the invitation of Steve Sparrow, KSPAN Coordinator, who spoke at the February meeting. Steve again encouraged individuals and companies to use the vast amount of free injury data available on their www.safekentucky.org website. Also, he again encouraged companies to participate in the Governor’s Safety and Health Conference will be held May 5-7 at the Galt House (see February minutes for details).

Open Mic – Plant-Related

An ambulance was called to Arkema on February 27 due to an employee fall. There were no serious injuries.

Dow postponed “You Be the Chemist” due to weather. The new date is March 24 at 5:30 at the Southwest library.

Zeon made a 911 call on March 6 for a butadiene release that occurred due to a gasket failure. Less than the 10 pound reportable quantity was released, so the call was precautionary. Corrective actions, including changing the material of construction, have been taken to prevent

reoccurrence. Some members responded that they did not get the Code Red notification of the release. Diane Vogel, Louisville Emergency Management Agency, responded that the alerts are based on the radius of the registered location (residence, etc.) to the incident, usually one mile. Diane instructed any concerned members to contact her directly and she will investigate.

Brian Long, DuPont Plant Manager, announced that DuPont will undergo a separation into two companies this summer. The landlord for the Louisville site will be Chemours, the new company. DuPont will continue to operate on the site as well. They are hiring three clerical employees. Go to www.dupont.com to apply.

RCAC Officer Elections for 2015-2016

Paper ballot elections were held for the RCAC President and Vice-President and tallied by a committee of three community members. Brenda Kelting was elected President and Phil Ball was elected Vice-President. Their terms will begin in April.

Committee Reports

Membership Committee – No report.

Program Committee – Rich Robinson discussed changes in the Program schedule for the year for RCAC. A one mile hike before the June meeting in Chickasaw Park has been added to the schedule. Also, an invitation has been extended to Reginald Meeks to speak at the December meeting. Updated copies of the Program Schedule were made available.

Projects Committee – Jana Zigrye discussed plans for the Neighborhood Clean Up to be held prior to the April meeting. The April meeting time will be adjusted to accommodate the cleanup. Dinner will be at 6:30 p.m. and the meeting will begin at 7:00 p.m. The groups will clean up the same three areas as last year - see below. Hexion will provide an additional team to clean along Campground Road. Zeon Chemicals will pick up the trash the following morning.

Pam shared her methods for advanced planning in the home for emergency situations such as weather emergencies or shelter-in-place. She described her methods for assembling a 72-hour kit and distributed a list of materials to include.
