Welcome

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by RCAC President Phil Ball, who also read the mission, vision, and ground rules. Introductions were made of all present. September minutes were approved.

Open Mic – Community-Related

Arnita Gadson announced that the West Jefferson County Community Task Force (WJCCTF) will hold an Environmental Justice workshop on October 18-19 at the Muhammad Ali Center. Free community workshops will be held on October 18 and workshops for businesses, academia, and agencies will be held on October 19. Denise Tennessee, EPA Region 4 Environmental Justice Director will speak. A 20 year celebration of the WJCCTF will be held on the evening of October 19, which will include excerpts from the Looking for Lilith Theatre Company's production "Prevailing Winds." Company exhibitors and sponsors welcome.

Lauren Claypool asked the group to spread the word that the Cane Run Elementary School, in partnership with Project Warm, will hold a teaching session on how to winterize homes on Saturday, October 15. LG&E and Community Action are co-sponsoring the project.

Beverly Jones reported that foul odors observed in the Park DuValle neighborhood during the week of September 13 were worse than normal. They seem to strongest at 3-4 a.m. She asked if any of the companies knew the possible origin of the odors and how neighbors can report an odor since Metrocall 311 is no longer available 24 hours a day. No unusual activities were reported by the sites and there were no further details on the characteristics of the odor. Tim Osburn clarified that Metrocall 311 is up from 7:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. He encouraged Beverly to call Metrocall 311 and speak with Jodi Duncan. The group was unable to identify the odors, but discussed updating the odor brochure, which characterizes some odors from the Rubbertown companies. Arnita Gadson added that the Health Department can be called during an odor incident. Martha Gammons stated that the Air Pollution Control District will follow up on messages left the previous evening.

Open Mic – Plant-Related

Guillaume Coiraton brought Michelin snow removal ice scrapers to the meeting for the group and welcomed all of those in attendance to take one to place in their car to use during this winter.

Darren Kremer informed the group that he attended the "Rubbertown" film that is currently playing. It is a documentary by a student filmmaker. The story was told from the perspective of three residents. He added that there would be another screening at the Galt House on Saturday, October 15, at 11:30 a.m.

Pipeline Emergency Preparedness - Jon Wisebaker/Will Gibson, Marathon Pipe Line LLC

Jon Wisebaker, Emergency Preparedness Coordinator for Marathon Pipeline, introduced Will Gibson, local representative for the pipeline, and Cassidi Gibson, intern.

Marathon Pipe Line LLC is headquartered in Findlay, Ohio, where the operations center is also located. There are three Marathon terminals in Louisville, which operate as a separate company. Marathon Pipe Line LLC operates over 6000 miles of pipeline in 14 states.

There are four pipelines running through Kentucky and three running through Jefferson County. In Jefferson County, all of the pipelines are product lines, not crude oil. There is a 6-8 inch diameter pipeline that runs approximately 15 miles from the Louisville Algonquin LP (light products) facility and terminates at the Louisville Airport. Another pipeline runs from the Louisville Algonquin LP facility in an 8 inch diameter pipeline for approximately 86 miles to Lexington. A third pipeline originates at the Robinson, Illinois facility in a 16 inch pipeline for approximately 132 miles terminating at the Louisville Kramers Lane LP facility and Valero.

Martha Gammons asked about earthquake preparedness. Jon Wisebaker responded that they practice a “Great American Shakeout” drill annually as part of their preparedness for earthquakes. Mary Woolridge asked what, if any, storage tanks are located in Louisville. They did not have that number on hand, but said that that they can get it if an email is sent to Jon Wisebaker (left business card).

Further information was provided on Marathon Pipe Line’s mechanical integrity, maintenance, and accident prevention programs. Emergency response plans and awareness programs were also shared. The pipeline industry is regulated by the Department of Transportation, specifically the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA).

Everyone was reminded to always call 811 before you dig.

New Member Consideration – Paul Graf

Paul Graf reviewed a membership application which was received by the Membership Committee from Lauren Claypool, Family Resource Counselor for Cane Run Elementary. The Membership Committee recommended her for RCAC membership. RCAC members will vote next month.

Facilitator Updates – Cheryl Fisher

Cheryl introduced Todd Steverson, new plant manager for Arkema. He shared that he has been with Arkema since 2010 and moved to the area from Carrollton in May.

All of the committee members who worked hard to make the 25 year celebration in September successful were thanked. A special thanks went to Lori Carson, who chaired the committee and spent many hours on the photo gallery walk.

Applications for the annual Charlie Hunton Award are open. Nominations should be returned to Cheryl by the deadline of October 31. An award selection committee was named. Selection committee members are Gordon Welker, Beverly Jones, Susan Clark, and Guillaume Coiraton. Arkema will sponsor the Charlie Hunton award again this year.

RCAC will hold the regularly scheduled December meeting at Lubrizol. The 25 year celebration took the place of the annual holiday celebration this year.
